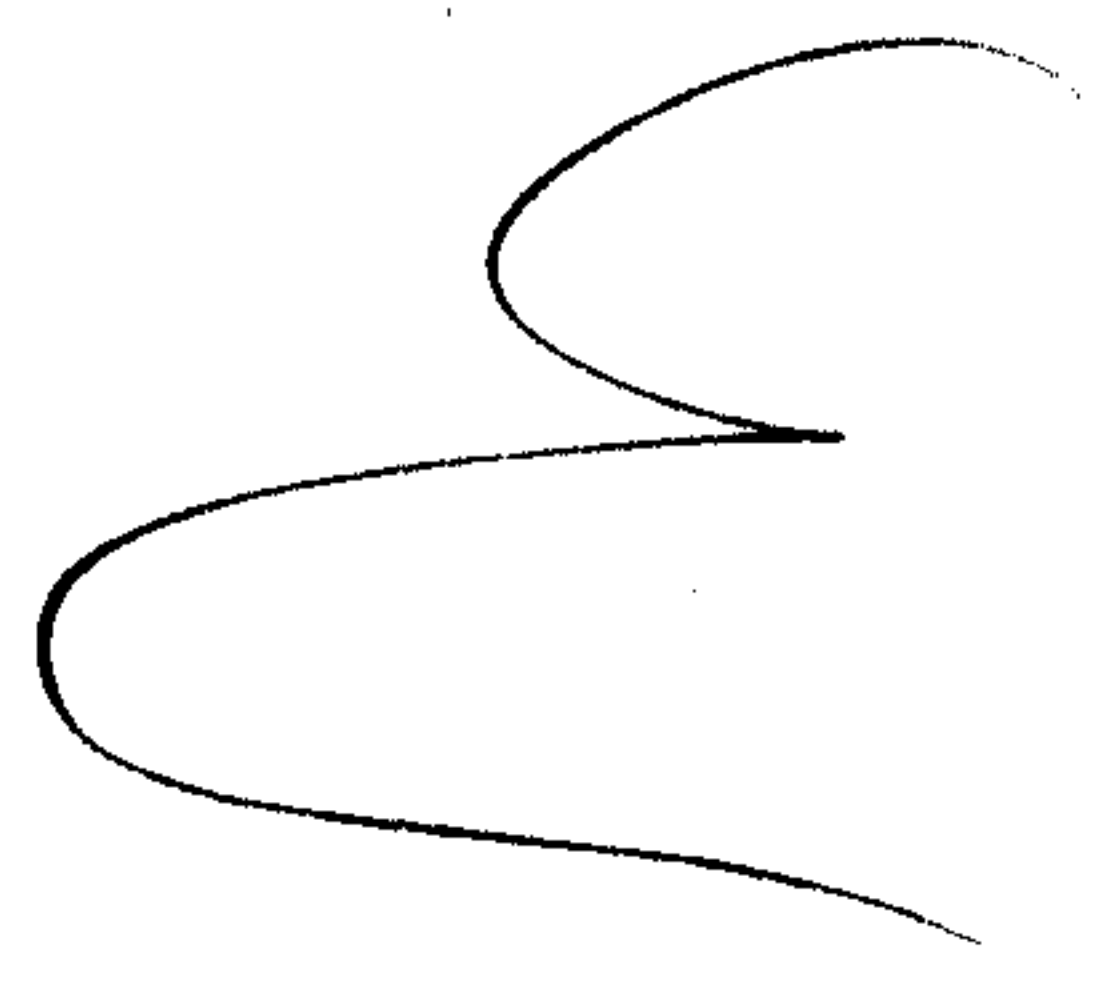

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Ole A. Grover, of Houston County Minnesota,

has deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States, a Certificate of the REGISTER OF THE LAND OFFICE at Brownsville whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said

Ole A. Grover,

according to the provisions of the

Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the North West quarter of the South East quarter of Section fourteen in Township One-hundred and four of Range Six West, in the District of Lands formerly subject to sale at Brownsville now Chatfield Minnesota, containing forty acres.

according to the official plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been purchased by the said Ole A. Grover.

NOW KNOW YE, That the

United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said

Ole A. Grover,

and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Ole A. Grover

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
